ATTAINMENT OF PROGRAMME AND COURSE OUTCOMES

Attainment of Course Outcomes In the Outcome Based Education (OBE), assessment is done through one or more than one processes, carried out by the department, that identify, collect, and prepare data to evaluate the achievement of course outcomes (CO's).

The process for finding the attainment of Course outcomes uses various tools/methods. These methods are classified into two types: Direct methods and indirect methods.

Direct methods

Continuous Internal Evaluation- Importance to Process

These methods are based on students' performance in various assignments designed for each course. At Ayojan we have a continuous internal evaluation process for the assignments. The nature of assignment varies from progressive development in design represented through tracings and/ or models, sheets, journals, group presentations, group discussions in class. The nature varies course wise, but fits into the larger goals of PO.

Generally 60% marks are reserved for process 40% marks are reserved for final outcome. Though there is flexibility for the subject team to decide.

Final End Semester Evaluation conducted by the SPPU University– Importance given to Final Outcome.

After the completion of a semester, students are assessed based on their performance in the final exams. They face 4 types of evaluation–

1. Viva-voce- Where students present their work, understanding and answer questions orally.
2. Assessment through the sessional work (In absentia)
3. Assessment of written exams conducted by the University

Indirect methods such as course exit survey and examiner feedback to reflect on student's learning. They are used to assess opinions or thoughts about the graduate's knowledge or skills

Method for mapping Course Outcome with Programme Outcome

For Assessing the attainment of Programme Outcomes, Following distribution is done-

Direct method – 80%

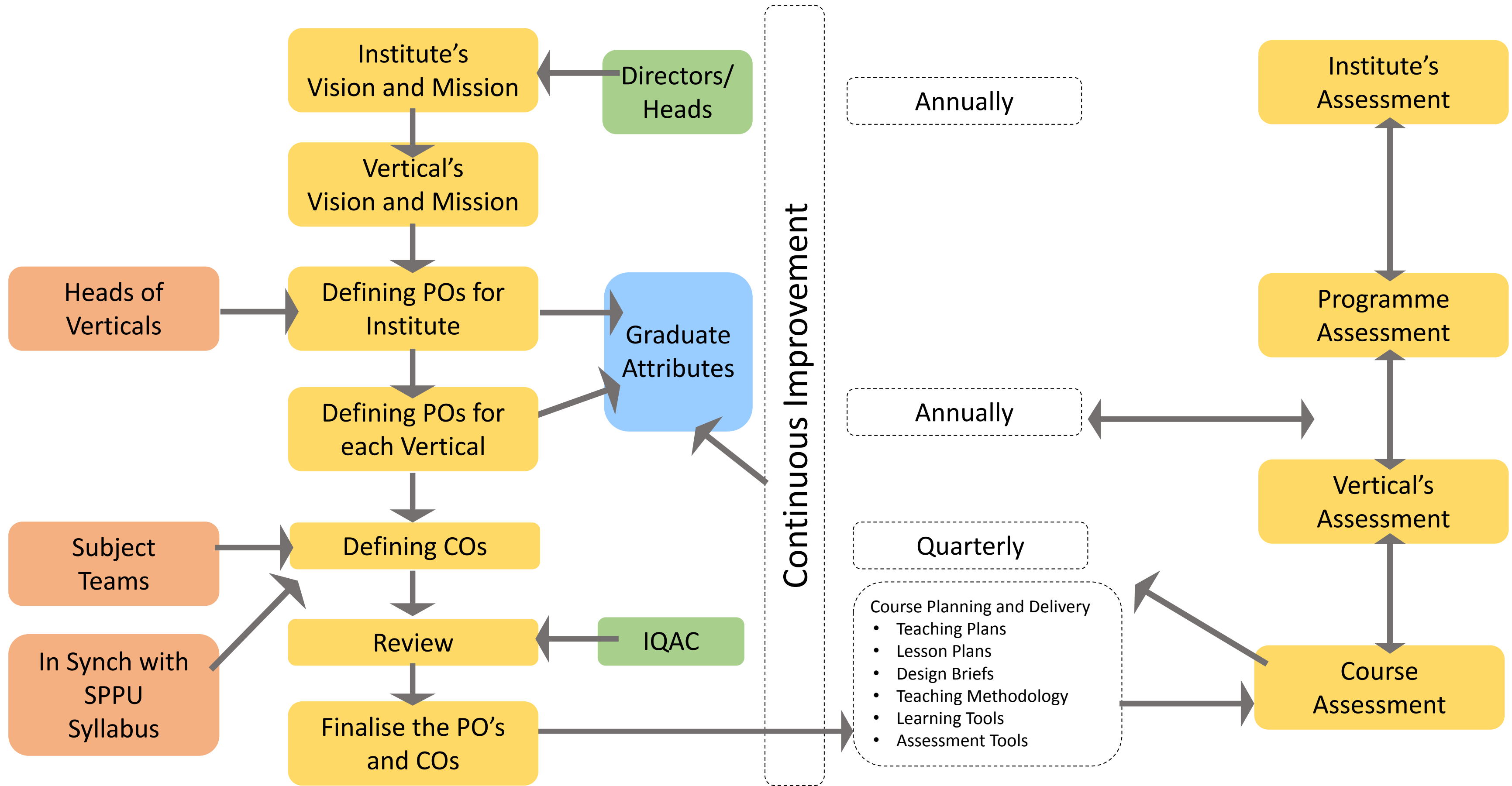
Indirect method – 20%

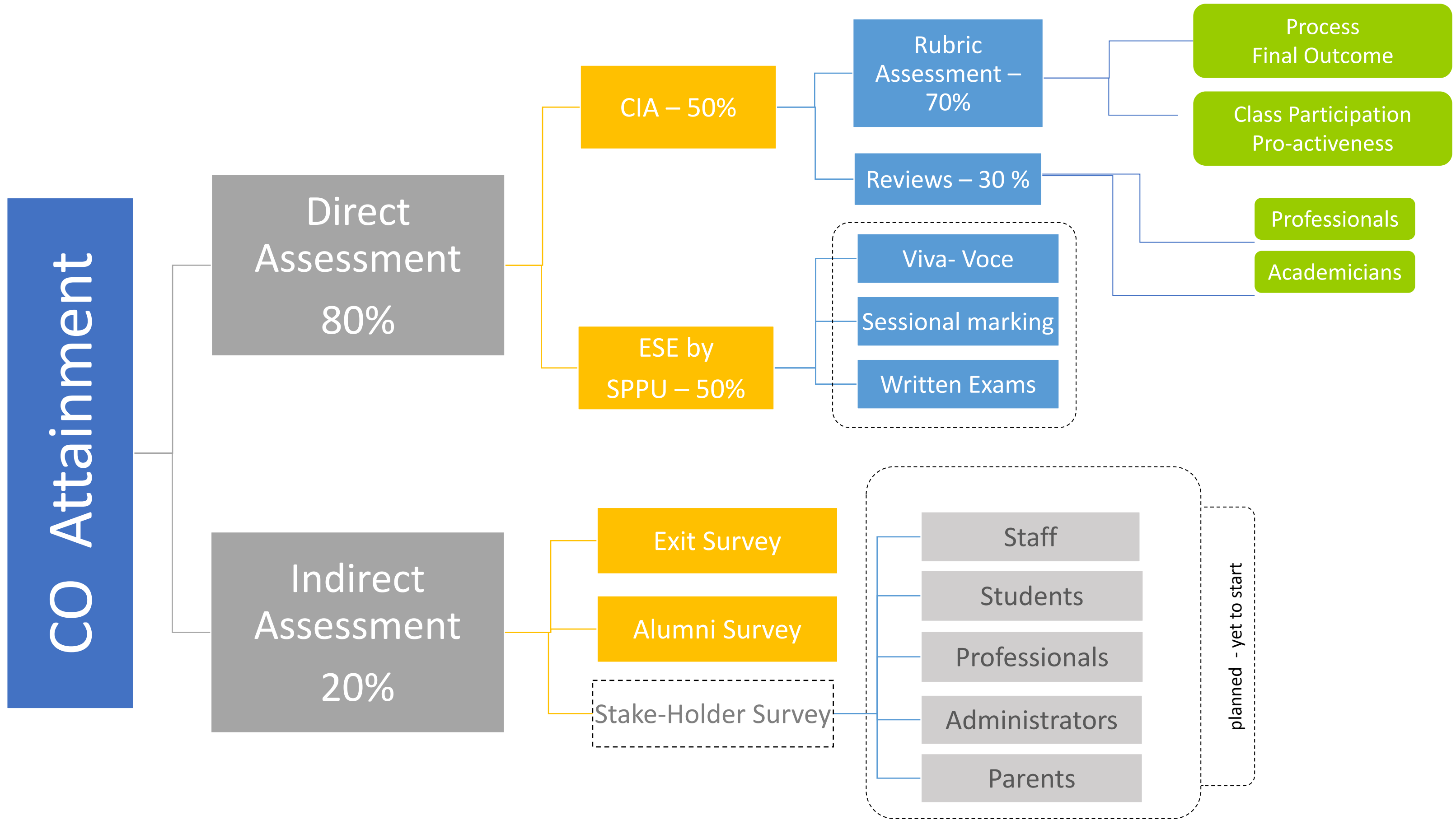
A detailed method shall be formulated-

The indirect method involves the 'Exit Survey' filled by the students. The survey may contain questions that are directly related to the Programme Outcomes.

In direct method- Mapping of attainment of the course outcomes with the Programme Outcomes shall be done. Cumulated and the average score shall be calculated which in turn shall contribute to the calculation of the attainment of the Programme Outcome. This shall be simplified by earmarking a few courses as culminating courses and the others as enabling courses.

Rubrics shall be used for both formative and summative assessment of students. Same rubric shall be used for assessing an outcome so that the faculty is able to assess student progress and maintain the record of the same for each student. The rubrics shall be shared with students before being evaluated so that they are aware of the performance criteria and their weightage

Direct Method of CO Assessment (Mark Based) Weightage: 80%

Rubrics for Attainment of COs through CIA & ESE

Attainment Level - 1:

50 % students scoring more than (50% for UG) and (50% for PG) marks out of the relevant maximum marks is considered to be attainment of “1”

Attainment Level - 2:

60 % students scoring more than (40% for UG) and (50% for PG) marks out of the relevant maximum marks is considered to be attainment of “2”

Attainment Level - 3:

70 % students scoring more than (40% for UG) and (50% for PG) marks out of the relevant maximum marks is considered to be attainment of “3”

50% students giving more than 3 is considered to be attainment of "1"

Attainment Level - 2:

60% students giving more than 3 is considered to be attainment of "2"

Attainment Level - 3:

70% students giving more than 3 is considered to be attainment of "3"
